Calder Avenue, Court, Crescent, Place and Terrace.

Leonard G. Calder (1870-1943) came to Saskatoon in 1903 as a CPR locomotive engineer. President of the Saskatoon Loan 7 Realty Company from 1906, he became a city alderman the same year and was sheriff of Saskatoon from 1907 to 1929. Mr. Calder was a Methodist and an active Liberal. At various times he was one of the inaugural members of the YWCA in 1910. The Calders left Saskatoon for Montreal in 1929.

The "Who's At Your Door?" group works together to inform the public of upcoming campaigns in the city. (Collected funds are not shared but remain with the organization conducting each particular campaign.) Specifically, the public is told when they can expect each member organization to be knocking at their door, what questions to ask, and what to look for to make sure they are speaking to a legitimate canvasser.

Welcome to the World of Programming

Hello Adelaide Churchill Park residents. Great to see you are reading the newsletter and are interested in what is going on in our community. I am the new Indoor Coordinator and I'm anxiously waiting for my creative spirit to take over. It might be the 7, 5 and 3 year olds running around the house blocking my train of thought. As your new Indoor Coordinator I am hoping to offer our residents classes and activities that will get us out and active, learning and socializing. We have two great school facilities where most of our programs take place: St. Philip School and Hugh Cairns School (both with excellent outdoor rinks). From the 2007 Saskatchewan Health Insurance registration file we show to have 3515 residents in our community. This number breaks down into 1392 females 18+ years, 1338 Males 18+ years, 325 females 65+ years, 265 males 65+ years, 109 females <6 years, and 99 males <6 years. If you can make sense of those numbers you can see that we have a wide range of ages. We want to offer courses that are accessible, affordable and interesting for all of our members. This past session we offered a variety of programs but some of them never ran due to low enrolment (muscle sculpt) or instructor issues (Hip Hop, Ballet, Sports ABC, Belly Dancing). New classes like Digital Photography, Vermicomposting, Dog Obedience and Open Craft Night are being well attended; however, there is lots of space for more participants.
