Administrators' Message

Before and After School Parking Safety Concerns

We are still needing to remind people on a daily basis about not being able to park in "No Parking" zones. Some people are parking in the disabled parking zone, some directly across the crosswalks in front of the school and at the north-west corner of the school yard and some diagonally on corners of crosswalks. Vehicles that are parked across crosswalks or diagonally on corners of crosswalks make it very difficult for children attempting to cross the street to see oncoming traffic. In addition, the visibility of oncoming drivers is hindered because of vehicles blocking the view of children wanting to cross the street. For the safety of all, please park in designated areas only. Before attempting to park, please check for signage. Vehicles that are parked in areas that are a safety concern will be asked to move.

From the Board Table

Highlights from the March 4 meeting of the Board of Education:

Every meeting, trustees hear about a success story from within the division, which is known as Celebrating Excellence. At this meeting, trustees heard about Philosophy for Children, a program run at Hugh Cairns V.C. School in partnership with the University of Saskatchewan's Department of Philosophy. The program sees university and elementary students work together to ponder philosophical questions, which develops students' critical and creative thinking skills.

Trustees voted in favour of respectfully retiring the Bedford Road Redmen name and logo at the end of this school year. A process will be undertaken with the school to decide on a new team name and logo, which will be in place for the start of the new school year in September.



Student First - Have Your Say

Over the past three months, Student First advisors Patricia Prowse and Russ Mirasty have travelled across the province and heard from more than 400 students, teachers, parents and community members. All their work has been with a single goal in mind - determining the best ways to put students first in the provincial education system.

In late February, the Government of Saskatchewan launched the Student First online engagement tool, which will assist the Student First advisors to collect feedback from students, parents, teachers and the public on what is going well in the education system, what could be better and how we can work to put the student first.

The online tool provides the opportunity for the public to provide written submissions, respond to a survey and validate themes heard so far by responding to key questions.

PARENT SURVEY

A key aspect of Saskatoon Public Schools' Strategic Direction and the Ministry of Education's Continuous Improvement Framework is to provide stakeholders in our organization (i.e., students, parents, staff, and the community-at-large) with the opportunity to offer their input and advice regarding the operation and direction of the school division.

Saskatoon Public Schools' motto "Inspiring Learning" implies that we aspire to build a strong and vibrant learning community. When a high degree of learning community capacity is present, all members of the community feel valued, affirmed, and inspired. In addition, all individuals within the community are seen as colearners who learn with and from each other.

Insightrix Research Services has been contracted to administer a telephone survey of a representative sample of parents whose children attend Saskatoon Public Schools. The survey will take place from March 5-19. Parents will be asked to indicate their level of agreement with a series of statements (i.e., strongly disagree, somewhat disagree, somewhat agree, and strongly agree). The survey will also give parents the opportunity to offer general comments in an open-ended question.

Results from this survey will be reported to Trustees at a public board meeting and will be posted to our public website.
