


# COMMUNITY RINK HIGHLIGHTS

## **UPDATE FROM COUNCILLOR MAIRIN LOEWEN**

### **Adelaide Park Churchill Update**

Hello Adelaide Churchill residents,

Happy Holidays and a Happy New Year! I hope this update finds you well. Here is a brief overview of what the new Council has been working on since the municipal election in October.

The biggest project undertaken so far has been the review and approval of the City's budget for 2017. After about two days of debate, Council finalized the budget for the year ahead, which brings with it a property tax increase of 3.98%. This property tax increase will be distributed in the following way: 1.93% will go to the Roadway Levy to improve the condition of roads, lanes, and sidewalks, 0.55% will go to the Snow and Ice Levy to improve the snow and ice program, and 1.41% will go to remaining civic programs and services. Here are some other highlights from the 2017 operating budget:

- Over \$61.7 million invested in Building Better Roads including Road Maintenance, Snow & Ice Management and Street Cleaning and Sweeping
- Over \$13.6 million for the continued maintenance and design of the City's growing park infrastructure
- \$5.0 million invested in Access Transit, including additional operators which will provide an additional 4,800 rides to customers on an annual basis
- \$41.2 million invested in the delivery of Transit services to deliver 1,688 bus stops across 35 bus routes and 276 km of city streets
- \$97.5 million invested in the Saskatoon Police Service including 6 new Constables

On the capital side, here are a few highlights from the 2017 budget:

- \$28.7 million in Transit related infrastructure and planning as part of the Federal Public Transit Infrastructure Fund
- \$21.6 million in 2017 for the repair, replacement and renewal of existing water and wastewater infrastructure under the Federal Clean Water and Wastewater Fund
- \$7.0 million for Phase I of Recovery Park to improve Landfill sustainability
- \$32.1 million dedicated to paved roadway and sidewalk preservation
- \$5.3 million for the replacement of Fire Station No. 3 to improve community safety

In other news around the Ward, you will have noticed that the site preparation for the new Fire Hall #3 is underway next to St Martins Church. Construction is expected to begin on this project in March, and more details will be available in early 2017. In other construction news, the new Saskatoon Public Library in Stonebridge – the Round Prairie Branch – is now open to the public. Be sure to stop by and check it out!

### Proposed Community Garden in Churchill Park

A community garden is being proposed in Churchill Park for the 2017 growing season. With the recent sale of land from St. Martin's Church to the City of Saskatoon for the new fire hall (Station No. 3), relocating the church garden into the adjacent park was an important item to include in the agreement. Community gardens are a great opportunity to: grow healthy food, enjoy the outdoors, get exercise, learn from other gardeners, meet neighbours and develop friendships. A group of volunteers from the community work with the City and CHEP Good Food Inc. to establish the garden, and then the volunteers operate and maintain the garden. Individuals and families plant, maintain and harvest their assigned plots, and everyone in the garden helps weed pathways, maintain a communal plot, etc.

A public meeting is being planned for the spring to share information about community gardens, gather further interest from the community, and answer any questions or concerns.
