Hello Adelaide Churchill residents,

I hope spring is treating you well! Here are some updates from City Hall.

Town Hall Meeting

This year's Ward 7 Town Hall, featuring special guest Mayor Clark, will take place 7:00-8:30 on Tuesday, May 2nd in the Aden Bowman Collegiate Cafeteria. This is a chance to ask questions, share feedback, and hear more about Council's work across the City and in Ward 7. Hope to see you there!

Green Cart Program

Delivery of green carts throughout the city is nearly complete, and biweekly collection for the program will begin in May. Currently, about 57% of what Saskatoon residents dispose of in their black bins could be composted. Putting organic material in the black bin not only takes up valuable space at the landfill, it also prevents these materials from properly decomposing, which creates leachate and methane. By diverting yard waste and kitchen scraps to be properly processed we can extend the life of the landfill, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and create valuable composted material. This program will offer benefits for even the most experienced home composters, as the program will be able to collect meat, dairy, pizza boxes, and other materials that can't be processed in your back yard. Beginning in May, collection of the green carts will happen every other week, alternating with your black bin pickup, all year round. The monthly fee for this program will be \$6.73. DEED

The prospect of a new Downtown Event and Entertainment District (DEED) is getting a lot of attention within the community and at City Hall. Driven by the need for new facilities, and connected to our plans for Bus Rapid Transit, the process of planning and decision-making is a long one with many steps along the way. So far, Council has established guiding principles for the district, a pproved a preferred site and related land acquisitions, and approved a private management option for future facilities in the district. Council has yet to approve a funding plan for the capital project, and has directed that this project should not rely on property taxes as a major funding source. Moving forward, my attention will be on ensuring a sound financial strategy and clear community benefits for this initiative.

Finally, spring weather brings construction in Saskatoon. A full list of planned roadway projects in Ward 7 will soon be available, so check the City's website or email me at the address below if you have any specific questions. Thanks for reading, and feel free to reach out any time!

Did you know that APCCA runs a unique and really fun program called 'TRX Strength and Endurance' and it is run by one of our own community members who is TRX certified!

Are you wondering what TRX is? It stands for 'Total Body Resistance Exercise' and it is a form of exercise using suspension trainers.
